

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSULTANT

Hiring Office:	UNFPA Turkey Country Office, Ankara
Purpose of consultancy:	Turkey hosts about 3.6 million refugees of which 47% are women and girls, 25% at reproductive age (between 15-49 years old). According to the feedback from local governmental institutions, about 20% of the refugees live in rural settlements, where most of them are active as seasonal agricultural workers.
	Rural refugees in Turkey are usually concentrated around remote districts and villages which have a high potential for agricultural work. They are usually highly mobile during the planting and the harvesting season in the main agricultural regions of Turkey.
	The limited access of rural refugees to health and protection information and services due to long distances and limited transportation means between agricultural land, rural areas and district centers, long working hours of agricultural production and husbandry, mobile dynamic of agricultural production, language barriers, limited understanding of service providers regarding unmet needs of rural refugees and their work and life dynamics, to be unregistered and having little or no knowledge of service provision mechanisms and channels.
	UNFPA Turkey CO aims to respond to the healthcare and protection needs of refugees in rural, who have limited access to these services. The action focuses on increasing the availability, accessibility, and demand of healthcare and protection needs in the rural areas of selected 5 provinces (Adana, Bursa, Izmir, Mersin and Sanliurfa) in Turkey through providing mobile services in collaboration with the relevant Provincial Health Directorates and other stakeholders.
	The purpose of this consultancy is to support the project implementation by taking part in the service provision in the field. The consultant will work as Rural Refugee SRH Consultant as part of the mobile service units to ensure health and protection service provision to rural refugees.
Scope of work:	The consultant will be responsible for:

The health services will be delivered in the mobile service units.

	 In the field, monitoring 15-49 years old women; completing pre-natal and post-natal checks, cooperating with midwife/nurse during first examination and test in the existence of any pregnancy related risks; referring risky pregnancies to a relevant health units

	 Involving in awareness raising activities for health promotion Coordinating and monitoring awareness raising training conducted by midwife/nurse.
	 Ensuring delivery of maternal and child health services
	 Screening the community for communicable diseases, and reporting in the event of detecting any communicable diseases. Referring the cases in coordination with midwife/nurse, and implementing immunization programmes. Assisting with
